

AWARD CRITERIA FOR JUDGING THE JOHN P. MCGOVERN COMPLEAT PHYSICIAN AWARD

Seventy-five percent (75%) of the applicant's score will be based on Criteria 1-3.

1. **Practice** - Clinical care
 2. **Teaching/Education** - Medical schools and hospitals (students, residents, fellows and peers), other institutions, including continuing education for professionals, laity, etc.
 3. **Research/Scholarship** - Primarily clinical - laboratory (as differentiated from basic - laboratory research), national reputation, scholarship (publication) research, health policy, educational research, etc.

Twenty-five percent (25%) of the applicant's score will be based on Criteria 4-10.

4. **Medical Society Service** -
 - a) National (General and Specialty)
 - b) State (General and Specialty)
 - c) Local (General and Specialty)
5. **Health Promotion and Disease Prevention** -
 - a) Public Health Education
 - b) Writing, TV, radio and/or public speaking presentations
 - c) Involvement with support organizations, e.g. American Heart Association, American Cancer Society, etc.
6. **Service to Allied Health Professions**, e.g.:
 - a) Nursing
 - b) Schools of allied health sciences in medical centers
 - c) Departments of health education in colleges and universities
 - d) National and state school health associations
7. **Government Service** - (including volunteer, non-salaried)
 - a) National, State and/or Local
8. **Medical Libraries** -
 - a) General
 - b) Historical (Rare Books) Collections
9. **Medical Humanities** -
 - a) History and philosophy of medicine (including medical ethics)
10. **Philanthropic Activity** - Charitable, benevolent and humane gifts or acts which demonstrate a desire to help mankind.

Nominees are not required to be qualified by participation in all categories.
