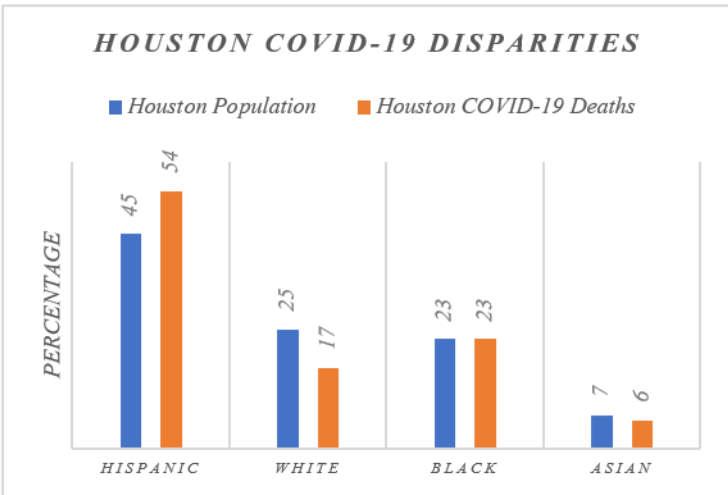




## Impact of Health Disparities on COVID-19

The following figures show an analysis comparing each racial or ethnic group's share of infections or deaths to the population. According to the Houston Health Department, as of September 2020, Hispanic people made up the highest percentage of confirmed cases and deaths due to COVID-19.

### COVID-19 and Health Disparities

COVID-19 is widely acknowledged to be most deadly to people over the age of 65 with underlying health conditions like obesity, diabetes, or heart conditions, and U.S. data show the disease disproportionately affects people of color.
