# H A R R I S C O U N T Y 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) Harris County Medical Society

# What you need to know

As a result of the COVID-19 outbreak, there have been several changes implemented which affect your practice.

## **Screening, Testing and Treatment**

- 1) Screen every patient over the phone, PRIOR to an in-person visit:
  - Do you have fever, cough, sore throat, or difficulty breathing?
  - Have you had contact with someone with known or suspected COVID-19?
  - Do you live in a community with confirmed ongoing transmission of COVID-19?
- 2) <u>Harris County Public Health (HCPH)</u> encourages residents to get tested. For screening information, patients can go to <u>www.readyharris.org</u>, or call 832-927-7575. HCPH has provided the following guidance on who should be tested.
  - Those who have had close contact with someone diagnosed with COVID-19.
  - Those who have other health conditions (diabetes, lung disease, heart disease, pregnancy).
  - Those who are age 60 and older.
  - Those who are residents of nursing homes.
  - Those who are part of an investigation of a cluster or an outbreak.
  - Those who are Healthcare workers/First responders.
  - Those who are asymptomatic who believe they have been exposed to COVID-19.
- 3) Additionally, select Walgreen's pharmacies have started testing for COVID-19. To be screened, patients can go to <a href="https://www.walgreens.com/findcare/covid19/testing?ban=covid">https://www.walgreens.com/findcare/covid19/testing?ban=covid</a> testing.
- 4) <u>Houston Health Department</u> is testing anyone wanting a test. People can call the department's COVID-19 call center at 832-393-4220, between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. Additionally, HHD is offering free <u>mobile testing</u>.
- 5) Texas Division of Emergency Management is offering free drive-thru testing. To obtain a test, visit <a href="https://txcovidtest.org/">https://txcovidtest.org/</a> or call 512-883-2400.

- 8) There are no known specific treatments for COVID-19. The treatment is supportive care to relieve symptoms. However, there are <u>FDA approved drugs</u> which are being tested for treating the virus. These are currently considered experimental and to be used only in a hospital setting.
  - 9) DSHS has <u>developed guidance</u> for releasing a patient from in-home isolation.

## **Practice Viability**

- 1) The <u>practice viability section</u> of the HCMS COVID-19 web page provides information on the new rules and laws designed to keep your practice viable.
- 2) The <u>Texas Medical Board</u> has issued waivers and guidance on issues surrounding non-essential surgeries, telemedicine, license renewal extensions and more.
- 3) Texas Medial Board (TMB) published <u>new emergency rules</u> that supersede past TMB emergency rules to comply with Governor Abbott's newest Executive Order GA-19. The rule adds required minimum standards for safe practice related to COVID-19, and the requirement to <u>post the notice</u> of those minimum standards. TMB has developed <u>FAQs</u> related to the new rules. TMA has developed a <u>white paper</u> to clarify the rules.

### PPE

- 1) Healthcare workers and patients need to practice routine infection control (*i.e.*, *handwashing*, *covering coughs*, *staying home when ill*, *and using PPE*). If you have limited PPE, then see the <u>CDC's strategies for optimizing PPE</u>.
- 2) TMA has created a <u>portal</u> for physicians which contains a PPE needs assessment form for your practice. TMA members, and nonmembers with TMA website accounts, can log in using their TMA credentials. Others can create a new account.
